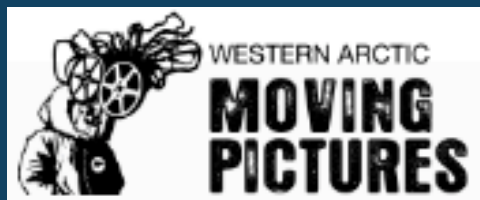

GARY JAMES JOYNES: SONIC SUNS

INSTALLATION



Sonic Suns is a dynamic visual-sound installation that beckons viewers into a realm where sound takes on tangible physical forms through light. It encourages a meditative state in viewers – to have them interrupt busy-ness for a prolonged moment of being-ness.

Joynes' fascination with esoteric science and the groundbreaking work of the visionary inventor Nicola Tesla adds an additional layer of depth to Sonic Suns. Tesla's exploration of sound, vibration, and frequency, especially his discovery of 6 harmonious tones with profound healing potential, became another source of inspiration. Created using a modular analog synthesizer, Tesla's 6 harmonic tones come to life, shaping vibrational wave energy that gracefully dances through a custom-made wave pool tank. This tank enables Joynes to draw and finesse sound through liquid resulting in mesmerizing analog visual-sound animations that are captured through video. When played simultaneously Tesla claimed these 6 tones have the ability to open and cleanse the human pineal gland. Also known as the third eye, this area of the human brain is believed by many faiths to hold the key to spiritual enlightenment.

Experimenting with these 6 frequencies has convinced Joynes something very special happens when engaging with them. Through Sonic Suns he invites us to join him into a visual-sound journey of exploration inside of these 6 magical tones.
